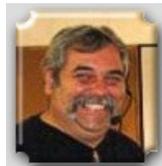

We needed to come up with a new name for ours here at Poway Station.

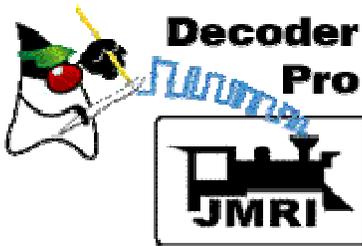
It has been tossed around at some of the General meetings but no final decision was ever made about another title or name.

Help with Decoder Pro by Jack Eiermann



Well I belong to an online forum on Yahoo for JMRI, which covers Decoder Pro as well as Panel Pro and Scripting among other functions.

You know how it is, you just skim these thing for something that might interest you. Keep your eyes peeled. I was noticing this conversation going on between two forum members regarding this very thing, importing new decoder definitions.

Well it is almost too simple.

The first thing you do is join the Yahoo forum for JMRI Users. Once you are up and running with that visit your group/forum and on the left side of the page are some selections to choose from.

Select "files" and it may sometimes ask you to sign in again (you know.....security).

Once into files then select "decoder files". Next begins

WGH Show Comes to San Diego

This was San Diego's first time to have the World's Greatest Hobby Show come to town.

Actually it was held at the Del Mar Fair Grounds and took up 2 of the large commercial buildings there, the Bing Crosby Hall and the O'Brien Hall.

Our application was sent in late November and we patiently waited for the word as to see if we got in the show or not.

Finally word came, we are in! Ron Walker worked hard to develop a track plan that would work within the space that they allowed us, which was roughly

32 x 32 feet. He came up with an L shaped layout that presented the clubs modules well to the public and allowed easy walk space for the viewers. We even had room for a greeting table which George Boggs faithfully manned through

a little hunt. When that opens you have a variety of selections of different manufacturers to choose from.

You may notice that there aren't many files listed within each manufacturer.

At the top of the page is a selection for "[Its not listed here!](#)".

Open that one and up jumps "[Another location for Decoder files](#)". You got it. Select that one and a page opens up with a note telling you "**The decoder file your looking for may be listed in sourceforge, try this link:** <http://jmri.sf.net/xml/decoders>

Use the same procedure as in the "How To" file.

Copy and paste that link into your browser and it will take you to "Index of /xml/decoders" where you will find all of the manufacturers and all of their decoders listed for which definitions have been written.

Select the one you want, place your cursor there and right key your mouse and select "Save target as" or something like "Save as", either one of which will require you to indicate where you want the file saved to.

Save the file in the .xml folder which is found in the JMRI folder. Expand the JMRI folder which has six folders and open the .xml folder and select decoders. Then save it to that location.

Now comes the easiest part. Open

Decoder Pro, and on the initial screen select Debug, then Recreate Decoder Index and after you've done that when you open the Programmer.....whoop.....dere it is, ready and waiting for you.

If you need a demo of this or help with doing this contact Jack Eiermann. He'll arrange to help you.

PS. If you search around the JMRI website you'll find all of these instructions also. They are hard to locate but worth the hunt.

Now, onto learning scripting (big dreamer ain't I)
